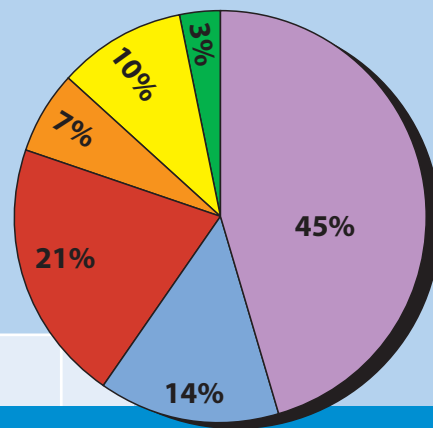

## Other Info

SAUSD is the 5th largest school district in the State, second only to San Francisco in population density.

Approximately 70% of SAUSD students are English learners. Spanish, Vietnamese and Khmer are the most common languages spoken at home.

85% of SAUSD students participate in free or reduced-price meal programs.

California averages 1,660 students per 40-acre high school campus, while Santa Ana averages 3,000 students on only 25 acres—a 4-to-1 denser ratio.
